## WHO ARE WE?

### **OPEN SPACE ASSOCIATION**

As the Open Field Association established in 2018, we aim to raise awareness about social, economic and urban problems; to be in solidarity with groups that have difficulty in accessing their rights and needs and are exposed to social exclusion; to strengthen these groups through various activities; to support these groups' access to public rights and services. We aim to reduce barriers to their access to basic human rights, including education, health, employment and social security. Cimenev Science and Art Center, which was established in this direction, is our first neighborhood-based study.

### **DEEP POVERTY NETWORK**

As a result of Çimenev workshops and experiences and observations from the field, a group of researchers, sociologists, psychologists and journalists came together to investigate deepening poverty and reveal its dimensions, monitor human rights and open poverty to discussion as a human rights violation, creating the Deep Poverty Network (DPN). DPN is the main active project of the Open Field Association.

**Vision:** A country where there is no more poverty which causes human rights violations and social exclusion.

As the Deep Poverty Network; in a multidimensional framework, we consider poverty as a phenomenon that restricts people's access to their basic rights and needs, as well as hinders their access to their economic, social, political and cultural rights.

## FIELD WORK



We visit to all districts of Istanbul, mainly Ataşehir, Çekmeköy, Ümraniye, Sancaktepe, Beyoğlu, Şişli, and Fatih.



The visits are paid by DPN staff consisting of social workers, clinical psychologists, sociologists and psychological counselors.



In neighborhood-based visits, we visit people and their families who apply to the Deep Poverty Network for support.

We sometimes make these visits to follow our social work guidance, sometimes to provide various supports, and sometimes to monitor human rights within the scope of a research.

### Why Solidarity?

We believe that solidarity should be shown in line with the principle of emergency response with people who cannot access basic food and care products in extraordinary situations such as pandemics and economic crises.

### Why Research?

As a non-governmental organization, we believe in the importance of conducting research, human rights monitoring and advocacy activities.


### Why Social Work?

We believe that social service planning should be done by taking into account the needs of every individual living in poverty conditions and the empowering effect of providing social service support for each individual's access to their rights.

### What was done?

As of March 2020, through more than 2,000 individual donors, we reached people living in conditions of deep poverty, mostly in Istanbul,

food, diapers, baby food, rent, bills, medicine, stationery and toys to more than 15,000 people in over 3,000 households.



At the initial stage, individual supporters made direct purchases to households through online markets.

We have transformed the solidarity campaign

#ChangefromHome to provide the increasing number of support and changing needs over time, in a faster and safer way.






As of 2021, we started sending a refillable grocery card/grocery code with a monthly balance of 400 or 600 TL, that supported households can use in certain markets;

Thus, people who do not have a refrigerator at home, do not have a specific residence address or who want to shop daily according to their needs can shop according to their special circumstances.

In addition, we also provide with periodic campaigns or collaborations, clothes, stationery and hot food supports.

# How are the households to be supported determined and prioritized?

In the in-depth interviews with the people who reach us through the association contacts, we record with the questionnaire we prepared to understand how much that household has access to their basic rights. Then, a priority order is formed according to the sensitivities in that household.


### What was done?

# Since March 2020, in order to expose the unsustainable conditions of poverty and to argue that it is a human rights violation, to mobilize the media and public institutions

We prepared five research reports, four information notes, two emergency calls, one storybook – audiobook. We translated four policy documents into Turkish and we also monitored the poverty agenda in the media and parliament.







We translated four policy documents prepared in the field of human rights and poverty from English and French to Turkish.



### SOCIAL WORK



### What was done?

Families were visited in the neighborhood and individual interviews were held.

As a result of interviews, the needs of the individuals and the obstacles they face in accessing public resources that can meet these needs were determined.

Information and guidance to reach Social Service Centers, SYDV and various NGOs were given to people living in poverty, in line with their needs.

With the cooperation with various institutions, people were directed to employment and trainings.
